deforestation of their lands. We have many styles and colors available. Stop by the Fair Trade Market after the service today!

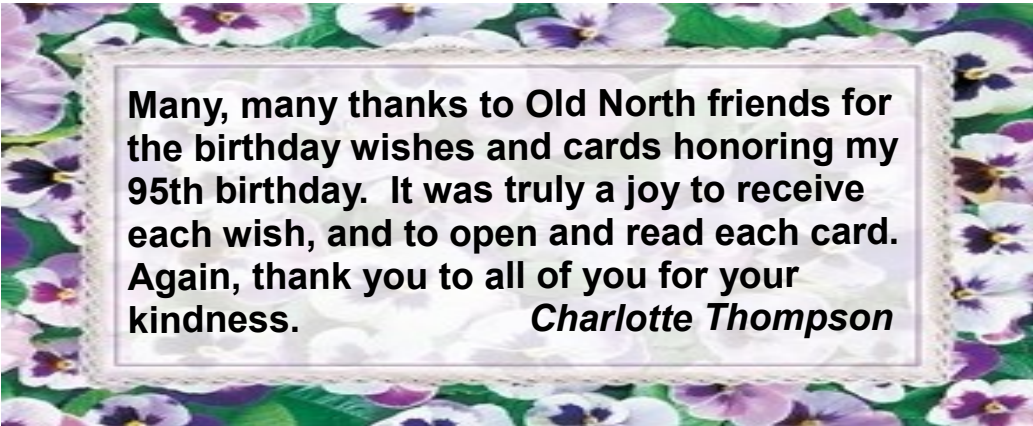
