We whipped out the store credit card and purchased some on the spot to bring back to the shop. However, upon our return, the scarves were nowhere to be found. Nancy remembered seeing them with the rest of our luggage at the Airbnb. Jerrienne remembered seeing them in the trunk of our rental car. Anne remembered putting them in the back of Jeannette's daughter's van. But

Jeannette's daughter couldn't find them. After that the trail went cold. Fast forward two months. Jeannette went back to Austin to visit her daughter and found the scarves! They were in a non-descript brown grocery bag and had gotten pushed back into a corner of the back of her van so she didn't see them when she looked. We are beyond thrilled to have recovered these beautiful scarves and they are now available in the shop. The colors are incredible and you can wear them in many ways.
