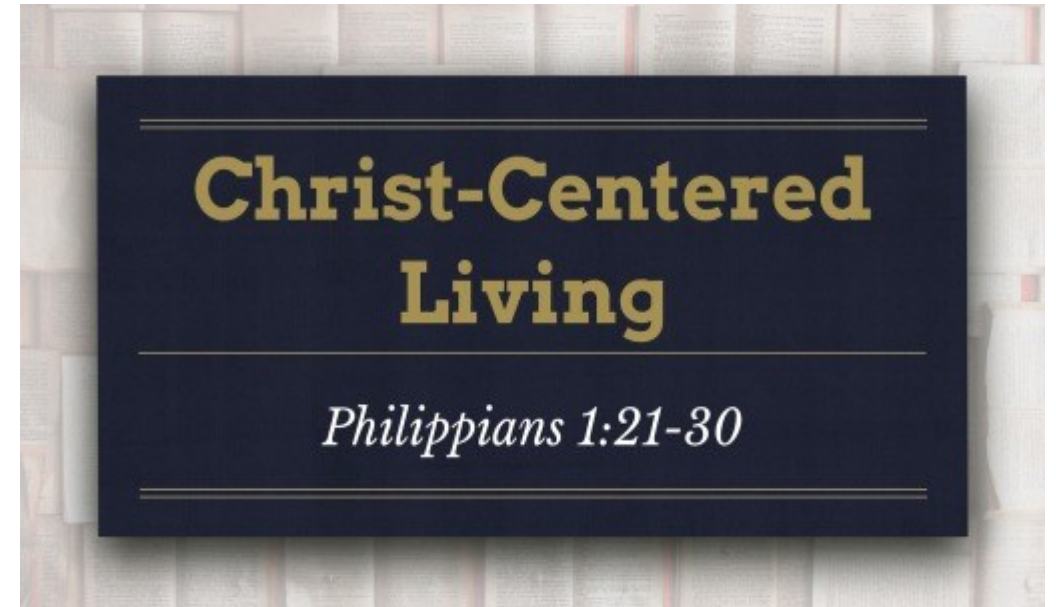

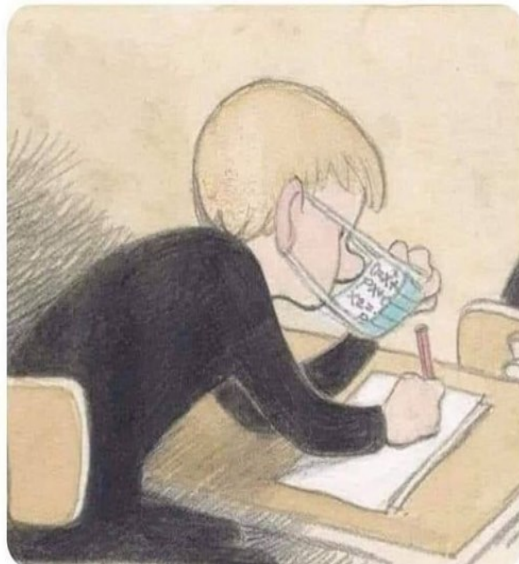

Guatemala is special to many of the volunteers in the shop and we carry a lot of items from that beautiful country. Mayan women are the most marginalized sector of Guatemalan society, with few opportunities for education or earning a living. Lack of alternatives and fierce competition forces them to sell their unique textiles at very low prices, sometimes under cost. Fair Trade has made a significant change in the lives of these women by providing sustainable markets while allowing them to keep their rich cultural traditions.
