Anxiety - Finding Comfort and Reassurance from God

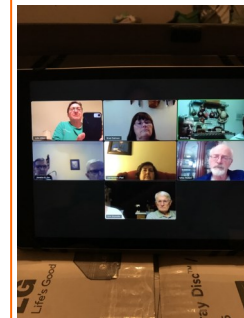
